On July 5th and 6th 2022, the second Two-day National Seminar in Collaboration with West Bengal Urdu Academy, titled "Urdu Research and Criticism: Problems and Prospects" of the Department of Urdu, Kidderpore College, Kolkata, was held with great pomp and ceremony



The Deprtment of Urdu Kidderpore College organised Two-day National Seminar with Collaboration of West Bengal Urdu Academy, under the guidance of Dr. Syed Ali Irfan Naqvi (Head, Department of Urdu) titled "Urdu Research and Criticism: Problems and Prospects" at Indian Medical Association, 4th Floor, 11/3 Braish Guha Street, Kolkata-17.

All the teachers of the college and other

dignitaries were also present on this occasion. The seminar was presided over by the famous and unique critic writer of the city Mr. Zaheer Anwar, while Dr. Abubakar Jilani (Ex- Senior Professor, Kpc)was the Chief-guest and the whole program was conducted by Dr. Shamshir Alam (HOD Urdu, TDB College, Raniganj).

After that, Dr. Syed Ali Irfan Naqvi gave a welcome speech and presented a gift of gratitude to all the participants of the seminar and the students.



Hon'ble Principal Dr. Abhijit Ganguly in his opening speech (English) highlighted the activities of Urdu department and expressed his love for Urdu language and literature. In the end, he also entertained everyone in the hall by singing Ghazal on the request of the audience and the distinguished Guests.

At the beginning of the ceremony, Dr. Dabir Ahmed(HOD, Urdu, Maulana Azad College) said that we people think of ourselves as researchers and critics by writing several articles, whereas this is not true because Farooqui, Narang, Arzoo, etc. have edited various genres of Urdu for 40 and 50 years. Then he was called researcher and critic. President of Urdu Department, Lucknow University, Dr. Abbas Raza Nayyar also joined.

Now the outsiders are also trying to understand the researchers and critics here, but I will say this to Irfan Naqvi that this two-day seminar will not sufficient for this topic, for that a separate 5-day workshop should be held and the Critics should be openly discussed. Artists and artworks should be understood. Dr. Jilani also spoke about the

situation of research and criticism in West Bengal. Dr. Mirza Shafiq Hussain Shafiq, who belongs to the city of Lucknow, while presenting his insightful and comprehensive keynote speech on this occasion, said that "disagreement" does not start with words, but with meanings. Criticism starts from where the difference of meaning begins.Then Mr. Shafaq further says that "O my people of Bengal! If you are ignored by people of other state, don't be sad because the tradition of ignoring is very old. Mohammad Hussain Azad also did not mention the famous Urdu poet Momin Khan Momin in his book "Aab-e-Hayat". Those who have not raised the pen against those who deserve it, have harmed themselves and not others."

After that Mr. Zaheer Anwar while presenting his presidential speech said that "Research is heart-burning work. 'The light of the eyes has to be burned.' Justice has to be done to the subject." After that, he further says that "When the mistakes were pointed out in theobituaries, criticism began to flourish. If nothing is being written about the people of Bengal, I am not worried that there are some people herewhom people from other states will be forced to write about. That time. It is not far that all the eyes of the people will start falling towards you, but they are starting to fall."

Apart from this, Dr. Diba Hashmi, Senior faculty of Urdu Department Dr. Swati Pal, IQAC coordinator, and Dr. Tanika Bhattacharya, convenor, Seminar committee also expressed their views in this opening ceremony. At the end of the meeting, Inamur Rehman thanked all the guests of honor. The first session of the seminar started at 12 noon under

the chairmanship of Zaheer Anwar. Dr. Irfan Naqvi has performed the administrative duties. The first paper of this session was presented by Dr. Arshia Iqbal (Guest Lecturer, Milli Amin College, Kolkata). The title of his paper was: "Research and Criticism in Murshidabad: Problems and Prospects". And the second paper was by Dr. Rehan Hasan (Head of Department of Urdu and Persian, Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar, Punjab). His paper was titled:"Contemporary Landscape of Urdu Research in West Bengal" while the third paper was by Maqsood Danish who titled his paper "An Overview of Fiction Criticism in West Bengal after Independence".



At the end of the first session, Mr. Zaheer Anwar advised Dr. Arshia Iqbal to avoid mentioning himself in his paper, while commenting on Dr. Rehan Hassan's paper, he said that if only two or four people were looked at. The article would have been more useful. After that, he expressed his views on the thesis of Maqsood Danish and said that Maqsood Danish should take care of ethics and some sentences related to Abu Zarhashmi have been made in such a way that they are against ethics. The first session of the seminar ended with a vote of thanks by Dr. Itu Singh (Department of Hindi).

Immediately after lunch, the second session started at 4 pm.



The session was presided over by Dr. Abubakar Jilani, while the administrative duties were performed by Dr. Rehan Hassan. The first paper in this session was by Dr. Nuzhat Zahra (HOD, Urdu Department, Surendranath College for Women) who presented her paper titled "Few Eminent Researchers and Critics of West Bengal after Independence". While the HOD of Urdu Department, TDB College, Raniganj, Dr. Shamsheer Alam delivered his paper entitled "A Few New and Old Researchers". And Mr. Zaheer Anwar presented "Urdu Criticism in Post-Independence West Bengal: With References to Some Credible Critics". President of the meeting, Dr. Abubakar Jilani, expressed his views on all the articles. Ms. Razia Sultana thanked all the people.

The third session of the seminar started on 6 July 22 at 12 noon under the chairmanship of Dr. Rehan Hasan and moderated by Dr. Irfan Naqvi. Bouquets, mementos and shawls were presented to the the writers. In the third session, Dr. Masood Ahmed presented his paper entitled "Part of Women in Urdu Research and Criticism". Thus, Dr.Javed Alam (Research Scholar 'JNU, Delhi) presented his paper "Urdu Research and Criticism: Problems and Prospects (Regarding West Bengal)" and Dr. Mirza Shafiq Hussain Shafiq (Department of Urdu Hasinaabad Government College, Lucknow) read his paper entitled "Bright Stars of the Sky of Cash and Research in West Bengal". In the end, Mr. Ashraf Ahmad Jafri made the closing session enjoyable by reading his paper titled "Situation of Urdu Literary Research in West Bengal."
